Responsibilities

The Information Technology Planning Council coordinates and shares information technology development and improvement plans with all areas of the institution by:

1. evaluating the adequacy of information technology resources to support established and proposed programs and services, to accommodate projected enrollments, and institutional priorities;

2. providing guidance in regulatory and policy matters;
3. establishing levels and categories for project review;
4. reviewing proposals for new information technology and major renovations of existing information technology;
5. recommending priority order for planned information technology projects;
6. overseeing preparation and submission of the annual update of an Information Technology Improvement Plan; and
7. coordinating the periodic revision of a long-range comprehensive information technology development plan.

Composition and Terms of Membership

All members are *ex-officio* and continue to serve as long as the member holds the designate office.

Reporting

The Information Technology Planning Council reports to the President.
